### Country codes

Country codes are equal to the two first characters of the currency code for the country in question. For example NO for Norway and GB for Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

### Beneficiary's bank

If possible, please state the bank's SWIFT address (also known as the BIC - Bank Identifier Code). The BIC consists of either 8 or 11 characters and may include letters as well as figures.

For countries not using IBAN (International Bank Account Number) the bank code helps ensure that the transfer is credited to the payee's account as quickly as possible. The most frequently used bank codes have the following formats (numbers indicate digits) and must be stated with the letter codes mentioned.

### IBAN

All accounts in Europe have an international bank account number (IBAN). An IBAN consists of a country code followed by the code of the account holder's bank and the account number. Please note that the composition and length of IBAN is not the same in all countries. If you need additional information, visit [www.danskebank.com](http://www.danskebank.com) or call your branch.

IBAN helps ensure that a transfer reaches the payee's account quickly and safely.

The IBAN is mandatory for all accounts in EU member states and Norway, Iceland, Switzerland and Liechtenstein and must be stated correctly. Otherwise we cannot accept a request for a transfer.

### Messages to the beneficiary

More and more countries and banks demand that payments be accompanied by information about the purpose of the payment, for instance an invoice number or a brief description. To avoid unnecessary delays, Danske Bank recommends that you always state the relevant information.

### General conditions

Danske Bank's General conditions and Terms and conditions for transfers to and from Denmark and transfers in foreign currency in Denmark apply to this order.

If an order that includes conversion into another currency is not executed, it may be because the payee account is closed or stated incorrectly. If that is the case and the payer wants to revoke the payment, Danske Bank is obliged to repay only the equivalent of the foreign currency amount in Danish kroner. The amount is settled at Danske Bank's ordinary purchase price at the time the amount is returned to us.

If we have sent the payment order to the payee bank, the payment cannot be cancelled. Danske Bank cannot be held responsible for failure to cancel the transfer.

### Transfers from Denmark - requirements from US authorities

Please note that information may be disclosed to the US authorities when you transfer money from Denmark. SWIFT (Society for Worldwide Interbank Financial Telecommunication) executes the payments and has been instructed to pass on information in case of suspicion of funding of criminal activities or acts of terror as defined in US legislation.
